Financial documents supporting financial capability may be included as an attachment and not count towards the preferred 10 page limit.
3	Has the Commonwealth determined a period of performance for the requested scope of services?	One year with the option of 3 one-year extensions.
4	Shall the project budget reflect only the first year of work or is the cost proposal to extend beyond the first year? If so, over what duration?	The proposal should reflect one year of work.
5	Does participation in this contract, if selected, preclude consultant team members from participating in other opportunities that may be related to or follow this assignment (i.e., a IJJA-funded projects and programs)?	The selected vendor or vendors will not be precluded from participating in other opportunities that may flow from or be related a contract entered into as a result of this procurement.
6	Is there a contract template that GBO intends to use with the selected vendor(s)? If so, will the Commonwealth be providing that for review ahead of the RFEI due date?	The Commonwealth does not have a contract template for this procurement. However, any contract entered into as a result of this procurement will contain all of the Commonwealth's standard terms and conditions which are available the Department of General Services' website.
