REQUEST FOR BIDS BROADCAST FOLIAR HERBICIDE TREATMENT STATE GAME LANDS #052 LANCASTER COUNTY

Prospective Service Contractors:

The Southeast Region of the Pennsylvania Game Commission is soliciting bids to apply a foliar herbicide treatment to approximately 53 acres on state game lands located in Lancaster County. The location of this project is defined on the attached maps. Specifications are detailed in Attachment 1 of the bid packet.

Bids are to be submitted electronically thru the Commonwealth's "PA Supplier Portal" system **by 2 PM January 25, 2023**. If you have not registered as a vendor with the state, you must do this first at <u>www.pasupplierportal.state.pa.us</u> before submitting an electronic bid. This bid will be awarded to the bidder with the lowest per-acre price. The **per acre price** shall include the cost of labor, insurance, and all miscellaneous expenses necessary for the completion of the tasks. Prices bid shall be in dollar and cents only. Payment will be dispersed based on the number of acres completed as per the required specifications. <u>The work may begin after the PO is received and a</u> <u>performance bond is provided. The work must be completed by May 20, 2023</u>.

HERBICIDE APPLICATION CONTRACT

I. SCOPE OF WORK:

- A. The Pennsylvania Game Commission, Southeast Region Forestry Division, requires the services of an Operator to apply herbicide to approximately 53 acres on SGL 052. Services shall include, but are not limited to, the furnishing of all materials, labor, equipment, tools, superintendence, miscellaneous items, and performing all work necessary to complete the project to the satisfaction of and subject to the approval of the Commission.

II. CONTRACT TASKS:

- A. **Project Location:**
 - 1. SGL #052 Lancaster County, Brecknock Township: the contractor will apply the designated herbicide mixture to the foliage of the understory vegetation. The project area will be treated as soon as invasive species (multiflora rose, bush honeysuckle, barberry, and autumn olive) are fully leafed out and prior to other regeneration leafing out, between March 1 and May 20, 2023.

III. SITE INSPECTION AND ASSISTANCE:

- **IV. COMMISSION PERSONNEL** The Commission will furnish personnel to supervise and direct the operation in the following capacities:
 - a. **PROGRAM SUPERVISOR** The Regional Forester of the PA Game Commission Southeast Region is responsible for the overall operation of the vegetation control program and represents the Commission in settling minor contractual matters.
 - b. FIELD CONTRACT COORDINATORS These persons are Regional Foresters or their designee who serve as the Commission's field liaison with the Operator and are responsible for reviewing and approving/disapproving the operations plan and conducting quality control

checks on the equipment and performance during the operations. This person is responsible for coordinating the activities of all people working on the contract within a region and communicating with the Operator's project supervisor concerning any operational problems or changes in plans. He/she also provides daily reports of the operation to the program supervisor

V. EQUIPMENT SPECIFICATIONS:

a. Equipment used on the project must be able to successfully complete the project and meet the approval of the Field Contract Coordinator.

VI. CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS:

- Apply the following herbicide solution to the foliage of understory vegetation. The herbicide will be combined with enough water to ensure thorough coverage.
 - 1. 3 quarts per acre of glyphosate (Accord or equivalent) minimum of 52% active ingredient.
 - 2. 2 ounces per acre of metsulfuron methyl (Escort or equivalent) minimum of 60% active ingredient
 - 3. Adjuvants: a non-ionic surfactant of at least 80 percent active ingredient (16-ounce AI/A)
- The project area will be treated as soon as invasive species (multiflora rose, bush honeysuckle, barberry, and autumn olive) are fully leafed out and prior to other regeneration leafing out, between March 1 and May 20, 2023.
- All work must be completed by May 20, 2023.
- The Operator shall exercise care and caution in all operations to prevent damage to all plants not specified for treatment.
- Damage to trails, roads, streams, or utility rights-of-way caused by the Operator's equipment must be repaired by the Operator at their expense.
- Any trash resulting from the Operator's operations must be removed from the area and properly disposed.
- The Operator shall not block any roads or trails in the area during performance of this contract. The Operator shall not in any way hinder the progress of any Timber Sale Contracts in these areas.
- All labor, equipment, tools, etc., needed to complete contracted projects are to be provided by the Operator.
- Timber Damages when in the opinion of Field Contract Coordinator, damage to the residual stand becomes excessive, the Operator shall pay the Commission a fair base current value determined by the Field Contract Coordinator per unit of volume. If this value for damage due to Operator's carelessness or negligence is less than \$10.00 per tree, then a minimum charge of \$10.00 per tree will be made whether the tree is commercial, non-commercial, merchantable, or non-merchantable.

VII. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:

- A. The contractor will provide Workmen's Compensation insurance sufficient to cover all the employees of contractor working to fulfill this contract.
- B. Comprehensive General Liability Insurance, including bodily injury and property damage insurance, to protect the Commonwealth and the contractor from claims arising out of the performance of the contract. The amount of bodily injury insurance shall not be less than \$300,000.00 for injury to or death of persons per occurrence. The amount of Property Damage Insurance shall not be less than \$300,000.00 per occurrence.

<u>Such policies shall name the Commonwealth as an additional insured</u>. Prior to the commencement of work under this contract, the contractor must provide the Commonwealth with current Certificates of Insurance. These Certificates shall contain a provision that coverages afforded under the policy shall not be canceled or changed until at least thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to the Commonwealth.

The Commonwealth shall be under no obligation to obtain such certificates from the Operator(s). Failure by the Commonwealth to obtain the certificates shall not be deemed a waiver of the Operator's obligation to obtain and furnish certificates. The Commonwealth shall have the right to inspect the original insurance policies.

VIII. HOLD HARMLESS:

A. The contractor shall be responsible for and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Commonwealth from and against damages to property or injuries (including death) to any persons and other losses, damages, expenses, claims, demands, suits, and actions by any party against the Commonwealth in connection with the work performed by the contractor.

IX. BIDDING

A. RECEIVING AND OPENING BIDS -

This bid will be awarded on a per-acre price. The **per acre price** shall include the cost of labor, herbicide, equipment, insurance, and all miscellaneous expenses necessary for the completion of the tasks. Prices bid shall be in dollar and cents only. Payment will be dispersed based on the number of acres completed as per the required specifications. <u>Service Bid on the herbicide application should include the Unit</u> <u>Price (\$/Acre)</u>. Payment will be by Unit (acre) completed to the specifications of Attachment 1.

Bids are to be submitted electronically thru the Commonwealth's "PA Supplier Portal" system by **<u>2:00 PM, January 25, 2022.</u>** If you have not registered as a vendor with the state, you must do this at <u>www.pasupplierportal.state.pa.us</u> prior to submitting an electronic bid. The Commission reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

ALL VENDORS WHO CONDUCT BUSINESS WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA GAME COMMISSION MUST HAVE A VENDOR NUMBER ASSIGNED TO THEM IN ORDER TO RECEIVE PAYMENT FROM THE COMMONWEALTH.

The unit price (acre) shall include all labor, equipment, tools, insurance, and all items necessary for the completion of the project.

The posted results will contain the information of the apparent bidders, and all bids are under review until final award of the purchase order.

Quantities herein are only estimates and may increase or decrease dependent upon the needs of the Commission. Operator shall be paid at the unit price bid for actual services performed.

The Commission reserves the right to reject any or all bids and award contracts as it determines to be in the best interest of the Commission.

X. PERFORMANCE SECURITY:

A. As further guarantee of faithful performance of the conditions set forth in this contract, the Contractor hereby agrees to furnish the Commission with Certified Check, Savings Account, Irrevocable Letter of Credit, or other security acceptable to the Pennsylvania Game Commission, in the sum of **\$2,000.00**.

ANY SECURITY POSTED MUST HAVE AN **EXPIRATION DATE A MINIMUM OF ONE YEAR BEYOND THE EXPIRATION DATE OF THE CONTRACT**.

- B. Performance Security is due <u>no later than 30 days after written notice of the bid award</u>. Time is of the essence with regard to the provision of Performance Security. At the option of the PGC, failure to provide an acceptable Surety within 30 days will result in cancellation of the contract and the PGC may declare the bidder ineligible on future projects.
- C. It is further agreed that any performance bond guarantees the complete and faithful performance of this contract and full compliance with the conditions set forth herein, particularly as to construction repairs, restorations or other conditions to be performed and the Principal and Surety shall in no way be released or either of them, their executors, administrators, successors or assigns from their liability hereunder, notice to the Surety or Sureties of any such repair involving construction restoration and conditions to be performed, and extension or forbearance hereof being hereby waived.
- D. Failure to comply with any of the conditions of the contract herein mentioned shall result in cancellation of the agreement and forfeiture of the performance bond to cover damages sustained by the Commission. The Commission may declare the Contractor ineligible to bid on future contracts.

XI. OPERATOR REFERENCES:

After the bid opening and prior to awarding of the contract, the Commission has the right to request 3 references (names, addresses, and telephone numbers) of similar work performed by the Operator within the previous two (2) years as proof of qualifications to perform the work involved in this contract. Similar work is defined here as proof that the bidder has successfully completed at least 150 acres of tree cutting in a forested environment in a single calendar year.

XII. CONTRACT TERM:

The Contract shall commence upon execution and receipt of the performance bond and purchase order, but not before March 1, 2023. Work must be completed by May 20, 2023. No contract extensions will be approved. Forfeiture of the performance bond will occur if contract is not completed by May 20, 2023.

XIII. PAYMENT TERMS:

Payment shall be on a reimbursement basis for actual acres completed as measured by a Forestry Division employee. A block will be deemed complete when all items listed in the specifications have been met for that block. Invoice must state the number of acres properly treated and the dates the work began and was completed.

All invoices must have the Purchase Order Number, as well as the Operator's SAP Vendor Number on the invoice, along with the date the work began and the date the work was completed. The name and address listed on the purchase order must also be on each invoice. Failure to provide this information may result in a delay of payment.

Please Note: Vendors are reminded to **NOT** include employer identification numbers, Social Security Numbers, bank account information, or other personally identifiable information on their invoices. That information is uniquely tied to your SAP Vendor Number and, for security purposes, should not be explicitly stated on an invoice.

XV. PURCHASE ORDER(S) TERMINATION

The Commonwealth may terminate the Purchase Order(s) for its convenience if the Commonwealth determines termination to be in its best interest. Operator shall be paid for work completed.

3.1 -SCOPE

This work involves applying herbicide to 53 acres on State Game Land # 052.

3.2 – PROCEDURE & TERMS

- 1. Apply the following herbicide solution to the foliage of all understory vegetation. The herbicide solution will be combined with enough water to ensure thorough coverage.
 - a. 3 quarts per acre of Glyphosate (Accord or equivalent) Minimum of 52 % Active Ingredient.
 - b. 2 ounces per acre of Metsulfuron Methyl (Escort or Equivalent) Minimum of 60% Active Ingredient
 - c. Adjuvants: A non-ionic surfactant of at least 80 percent active ingredient (16-ounce AI/A)
- 2. **Spray Equipment** spray equipment must meet the following minimal specifications:
 - **Backpack Mist Blower** The mist blower must be able to discharge spray material thirtythree (33) horizontal feet and twenty-five (25) vertical feet. Additional requirements are a three (3) gallon translucent formula tank with content level marks, a five (five horsepower engine and the ability to dispense granular chemicals.
 - **ATV Mounted Sprayer** The sprayer system must be able to deliver spray material twentyfive (25) horizontal feet and twenty (20) vertical feet. Additional requirements are the ability to dispense granular chemicals, a twenty-five (25) gallon translucent formula tank with content level marks, a 12-volt diaphragm pump, a pressure gauge and switch, a spotgun capable of being adjusted from straight stream to hollow cone, and spray boom and a brass "T" valve to switch from spot gun to spray broom.

3. The project area will be treated as soon as invasive species (multiflora rose, bush honeysuckle, barberry, and autumn olive) are fully leafed out and prior to other regeneration leafing out, between March 1 and May 20, 2023.

- 4. The project boundary is painted with blue paint.
- 5. All PGC access roads, firebreaks, trails, and ROWs must be kept free of debris and equipment cannot block access.
- 6. All gates must remain closed at all times and locked when the contractor is not onsite or onsite working.
- 7. If heavy equipment is used, equipment will not be operated when ground conditions are such that excessive damage will result. The contractor may be required to repair areas that become rutted due to work, install water bars in areas that are of sufficient slope that erosion may occur, and apply seed (10 pounds/acre of clover, 3 pounds /acre of birdsfoot tree foil/acre), fertilizer (200 pounds/acre 5-10-10 fertilizer), and straw mulch.
- 8. Damage to non-target species will be the responsibility of the contractor. When in the opinion of Regional Forester, damage to the residual stand becomes excessive, the Operator shall pay the Commission a fair base current value determined by the Regional Forester per unit of

volume. If this value for damage due to Operator's carelessness or negligence is less than \$10.00 per tree, then a minimum charge of \$10.00 per tree will be made whether the tree is commercial, non-commercial, merchantable, or non-merchantable.

- 9. The contractor will remove all trash and garbage generated from the completion of this contract. This is to include all materials related to the support of felling tools and equipment, as well as items generated through personal use by the contractor's employees.
- 10. The contractor will notify the PGC forestry representative three days prior to beginning the project. The contractor may work at times other than the schedule of the PGC forestry representative. The contractor may be present at the final inspection.
- 11. Payment will be based on the number of acres completed to the specifications of the project. The PGC forestry representative will make the final decision concerning the number of acres completed to the specifications.
- 12. A representative of the contractor, with the ability to communicate easily and effectively with PGC representatives, both orally and in writing in the English language, and with the ability to communicate easily and effectively with all workers on the crew, shall be present at all times at the work site.
- All equipment will be cleaned of soil and debris before being moved onto site to prevent spread of invasive species.
- 14. The following are non-workdays for this project:
 - 1. The opening day and all Saturdays during spring gobbler season, including the youth spring gobbler hunt.

3.3 - MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

A price per acre will be the unit of bidding and payment will be based on the number of acres successfully treated. Evaluation of the success of the treatment will be based on the quality of application to designated stems on a per acre basis.
