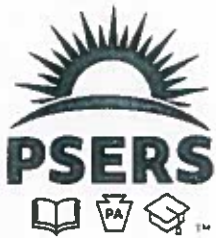

Dear Annuitant Member:

The Public School Employees' Retirement Code permits the retired members of PSERS (Annuitants) to elect ONE member from among its membership to serve on the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for a term of three years.

It is important to understand the duties of a PSERS board member. There are 15 Board members, which includes members of the General Assembly from both parties, the State Treasurer, the Secretary of Education, the Secretary of Banking and Securities, the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania School Boards Association, four active members, one gubernatorial appointee, one member elected by school directors, and one annuitant member.

Board members are Trustees of the system and perform a significant fiduciary role. They attend at least 12 days of meetings per year, and serve on two or more of the Board's nine standing committees. They make critical decisions on the types of investments made by the fund, including asset allocation and long-range strategic plans, all of which help to ensure that the retirement funds are invested wisely to guarantee the future benefits promised to the members of the system. They rule on member and annuitant appeals on benefits issues. They provide guidance to the system's administrative staff in policy-making areas. They also serve as a resource for annuitants in all pension-related matters.

Please follow the voting instructions and either cast your ballot electronically or return the completed ballot in the business reply envelope to [redacted] before noon on November 22, 2019. Electing an annuitant to represent your perspective on the Retirement Board is important. Please vote!
