SPECIFICATIONS  
PSP BESO EQUINE VETERINARY SERVICES**

**I-1. Statement of the Project.**

The Pennsylvania State Police (PSP), Bureau of Emergency and Special Operations (BESO) is issuing this Invitation for Bid (IFB) to procure Equine Veterinary Services. These specifications and quantities are set forth in these specifications as for all related products and services. Services to be effective upon issuance of valid purchase order for a period of one (1) year with four (4) optional one (1) year renewals.

**I-2. Specification and Quantity.**

Bids shall include quoted rates for periodic, routine and non-routine services and provide unit costs for all anticipated related services. Miscellaneous supplies and medications, and miscellaneous medical treatments and examinations not included in the quoted rates shall be invoiced to PSP at the vendor's current rates. PSP will only accept invoices and issue payments for actual supplies and medications provided, and actual treatment and examination services performed.

Item	Quantity
1. Bi-Annual Vaccination: Vetera Goldxp Bi-annual vaccination for Eastern, Western Encephalomyelitis, Tetanus, Rhinopneumonitis, Influenza and West Nile Virus. Administered per horse twice a year, generally 6 months apart.	60
2. Annual Vaccination: Equine Potomavac + Rabies Annual vaccination for Potomac Horse Fever and Rabies. Administered per horse once a year generally in the spring	30
3. Bi-annual Vaccination: Duramune Lyme Bi-annual vaccination for Lyme Disease. Administered per horse twice a year, generally 6 months apart.	60
4. Annual Vaccination: Potomavac	30

Booster vaccination for Potomac Horse Fever. Administered per horse once a year generally in the fall.	30
5. Annual Vaccination: Botulism (Botvax) Booster vaccination for Botulism. Administered once per horse per year.	30
6. Digital Coggins Test: Equine Infectious Anemia Blood draw, Lab and Global Vetlink fee for the testing of Equine Infectious Anemia. Generally taken once per horse per year.	30
7. Lyme Multiplex Test: Blood sample drawn and sent to outside laboratory for testing of Lyme Disease for diagnosis of disease or pre-vaccination	10
8. Digital Health Certificates: Health examination needed for transporting horses to certain events or locations. This fee also covers paperwork and Global Vetlink fee needed by government and/or event committees	90
9. Fecal Testing: annual fecal sample analysis Testing for intestinal parasites once per year per horse generally in the fall.	30
10. Deworming Plan: Strategic deworming based on fecal analysis, 3 treatments per horse per year. Spring deworming Moxidectin, July deworming Ivermectin and Fall deworming with Ivermectin/Praziquantel generally	90
11. Bi-annual Dental examination: Perform a Bi-annual Dental examination for abnormalities of the teeth and mouth twice per horse per year	60
12. Dental Float: Examination of mouth with dental speculum and dental float with the Powerfloat. Generally expected that half of horses will need to be floated in Spring and half in Fall, once per horse per year.	30
13. Preventive Healthcare Examination: Performed in conjunction with administration of vaccines. Examination performed: Heart rate, temperature, body condition score (out of 9).	60

14. General Physical Examination: Horse Acceptance Examination Donated horses to the Academy to have an Initial Acceptance examination performed to confirm general physical health. Full lameness not evaluated.	6
15. Physical Examination: Purchase Examination Extended physical examination including flexion testing for lameness and the aid of the Lameness Locator (if necessary) diagnostic equipment for a horse purchased by the PSP for duty	10
16. Physical Examination: Purchase Examination-Out of Area Extended physical examination including flexion testing for lameness and the aid of the Lameness Locator (if necessary) diagnostic equipment for a horse purchased by the PSP for duty	10
17. Digital Radiography: Digital X-rays Digital radiographs (x-rays) taken per view (single)	150
18. Non-Emergency Calls: Appointment Non-emergent or routine-based farm calls to the PSP's barn during routine business hours.	50
19. Urgent Calls: Urgent based farm calls to the PSP's barn during routine business hours that are seen the same day but worked into the daily schedule.	20
20. Emergency Calls: Emergency based farm calls to the PSP's barn that must be seen right away during routine business hours or after hours.	20
21. Therapeutic Shoeing: Farrier Therapeutic shoeing performed by farrier other than contracted farrier for a specific horse with a specific non routine foot problem.	6
22. Miscellaneous: Estimated miscellaneous supplies, medications, and diagnostics as well as miscellaneous medical treatments and examinations not specified in the aforementioned	\$30,000

examinations, inoculations and diagnostics, such as but not limited to puncture, lacerations and abrasion type wounds, colic types, lameness, fevers, diarrhea and/or ocular issues.	
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**I-3. Additional Conditions.**

The fully executed purchase order will be an estimate of scheduled and unscheduled veterinary services for an initial one year period. If service usage exceeds the original estimated amounts for the effective time period of the purchase order, the contracted vendor agrees to provide the additional units of service needed at the original contracted rates.

**I-4. Delivery/Service Location.**

Services must be available on a 24 hour per day basis. Veterinarian must be able to respond to PSP stable for emergency calls within 1 hour.
